FEED APPLICATIONS: COTTONSEED CAKE

The solid residue from oil extraction—cotton seedcake—represents a valuable protein-rich feed supplement for dairy cattle. High in protein (22-26%) and digestible nutrients, it commands steady demand from dairy farmers and livestock operations. This by-product stream adds significant value to the overall crushing operation.

QUALITY GRADES: WHAT BUYERS PAY PREMIUM FOR

Different buyer segments prioritise specific quality attributes. Understanding grade classifications helps optimise your procurement strategy and margin potential.



CRUDE OIL

Buyer: Refiners **Profit Margin:** Medium Unrefined oil requiring further processing. Lower entry price, suitable for bulk commodity trading.



RBD EDIBLE OIL

Buyer: Food Manufacturers **Profit Margin:** High Refined, bleached, deodorised oil meeting food-grade standards. Commands premium pricing.



PACKED TINS

Buyer: Retail & Wholesale **Profit Margin:** Very High Consumer-ready packaging adds maximum value. Highest margin opportunity in retail distribution.



INDUSTRIAL GRADE

Buyer: Soap Makers & Industry **Profit Margin:** High Lower purity requirements than food-grade, but consistent volume demand drives profitability.
